#### 2019 ★★★★

A very good vintage, but also not consistent, especially in Verduno, La Morra and Novello. Better instead in Castiglione Falletto, Serralunga d'Alba and Monforte d'Alba. Many good wines, which will last, but few capable of getting straight to the heart, perhaps because they are still closed and less seductive than the 2020s.

#### 2018 ★★★

As far as quality is concerned, it is permissible to think that the 2018 vintage will be classified in the future as of good level, but not more. At the same time, according to the opinon of many producers and professionals, it will also be a vintage in which the most prestigious crus will have an important edge (as they surely had from a viticultural point of view).

#### 2017 ★★★

So far we can record a positive vintage overall – better than might be expected from a hot, dry year without the overripe tones that were typical of the 2003 vintage. That said, style and the quality can be slightly inconsistent from MGA to MGA and from producer to producer.

#### 2016 \*\*\*\*

Judging by the comments that greeted the wines when they came on the market, one could not consider 2016 anything less than a great vintage, particularly in light of such unanimous agreement. The wines show the classic traits of the classic vintages of the past combined with balance, completeness and depth that is truly rare.



Savoury without being difficult, with a good body and, in general, more intense than the wines of the 2012 vintage, even if exceptions are not lacking. The late harvest seems to have favoured the historic and better exposed crus.

Compared to 2011, which it partly resembles, however, the wines do not succeed in expressing the same generosity and the same continuity of results even if certain exceptions are not lacking, just as they are not lacking if we compare them to those of 2013, that are, nonetheless, generally superior.

#### 2010 \*\*\*\*

For many, the 2010 Barolo is the best vintage which the appellation produced between 2000 and 2014. If in single specific cases this is the truth, on the whole the 2008 appears to have more to offer in terms of homogeneity of results and brilliance of character (and something less in terms of intensity). After this piece of hairsplitting, it is nonetheless indisputable that 2010 must be numbered among the vintages of excellence.

#### 2008 ★★★★★

The wines have the fascination, the class, and the varietal character which can be found in other vintages which finish with the number '8' (i.e. 1988 and 1998), particularly now that the wines have had a proper period of aging. Even more, compared to the previous two cited, they succeed in expressing the depth, vitality and length of a superlative vintage.

### CHAMPAGNE DE VENOGE

The history of the Maison de Venoge begins in 1837 when Henri-Marc de Venoge founded the Maison de Champagne de Venoge in the French municipality of Mareuil-Sur-Ay. De Venoge is the creator of the first ever illustrated label in the history of champagne, in 1838, and the Maison chose the blue ribbon of the Knights of the Order of the Holy Spirit as its emblem, one of the most iconic labels of all time, the Cordon Bleu. La Maison de Venoge has been a worldwide ambassador for champagne for 180 years with refined products of absolute excellence. And now their champagnes are available in Thailand for the very first time.

The Cordon Bleu champagnes, dominated by Pinot Noir, express the roundness and a certain vinosity typical of this grape variety.

# LES CUVÉES PRINCES


The Maison de Venoge resurrects the mythical Champagnes Princes created in 1864 by Joseph de Venoge in honour of the Princes of Orange. Its elegant and famous carafe recalls the crystal flasks in which European aristocracy used to decant their champagnes in the early twentieth century.

#### LES CUVÉES LOUIS XV

On the 25th of May 1728, Louis XV of France made viticultural history by issuing a decree allowing only wines of Champagne to be both shipped and marketed in bottles. This document was a most precious gift to the region; what was once a regional tradition was about to become a true phenomenon. Bottling meant that the sparkle created during fermentation could be preserved only for wines of Champagne, marking the birth of Champagne as we know it today.

#### 2018

Autumn and winter were grey and very wet. The November-January period recorded the highest rainfall after the previous record year of 1965. The cold arrived in February with some snow. Spring was very wet with even some frost as late as early May. Summer arrived with high temperatures and the weather remained nice, allowing the vineyard to grow healthy. At harvest, the grapes were in perfect conditions, the amount of sugar and aromatic richness were above average. Freshness, fruitiness and elegance makes 2018 a good vintage.

#### 2017

Winter was cold and sunny. Milder weather appeared in the first half of April, only to experience a second period of frost in the second half of the month. Everything changed in May as the month was particularly hot (35°C in May 27 & 28, a record for the last 10 years). The harvest began August 26th (very early), which made it one the earliest harvests since 1950, after 2003, 2007 & 2011. Even though 2017 is an uneven vintage, Chardonnay and Pinot Noir did particularly well.

#### 2016

The 2016 vintage was not without its challenges. There was frost in late spring and very low temperatures in the vineyards, followed by a wet May, June and July, which increased the threat of disease. Thankfully August was warm and dry, which saved the crop, and harvest began on schedule in September. Fruit-forward, lush wines with vibrant acidity. Quality is generally above average, with Pinot Noir preferred to Chardonnay.



#### 2015

The 2015 champagne vintage began with a wet winter and mild spring, followed by an exceptionally dry summer until mid-August. The weather then turned to fine, cool, sunny conditions for the harvest. This vintage, while similar to 2003, shows a better balance of weight and freshness. Despite concerns over its ageing potential due to lower acidity, the wines are beautifully structured with ample, attractive fruitiness.

#### 2014

The winter between September and February showed record rainfalls with mild temperatures. Spring was dry, mild and sunny. Nature woke up 10 days earlier than average. Summer was fresh, humid and not very sunny. As a result the grape growing slowed down, and harvest started rather late. 2014 turned out to be a beautiful vintage. The Chardonnay wines show powerful & rich aromas. The mouth is full, fresh with some citrus notes.



#### **VINTAGE CHAMPAGNE**

#### 2008

2008 was a very cold year in Champagne. However, thanks to a dry and sunny first part of September, harvests started September 15th in very good healthy conditions. This vintage will be remembered as one of the great years in Champagne, with many of the region's most celebrated Chef du Caves putting on a pedestal above the legendary 1988 and even the infamous 1996.

#### 2006

This vintage is generally classified as a 'grand millésime'. Despite challenging weather conditions throughout the growing season, including a very cold and long winter and occasional frost episodes in spring, the quality of the grapes harvested was high. The summer began harshly with violent hailstorms damaging some vineyards, but scorching temperatures later in the season accelerated grape maturation, leading to a successful harvest period in September. Many Champagne houses and producers were able to produce exceptional wines from the 2006 vintage, characterized by good structure, balanced acidity, and complexity, making them highly sought after by wine enthusiasts.



#### **GROWER CHAMPAGNE**

Grower Champagne can be identified by "RM" on the label, the abbreviation for Récoltant-Manipulant.



#### LOW INTERVENTION

Natural wine is generally agreed to be wine with only minimum 'intervention' in the naturally occurring fermentation process, without fining or filtration. It is farmed biodynamically and made without adding or removing anything in the cellar or using additives or processing. We prefer the term 'low intervention' as wine always needs someone to train the vines, process and contain the fruit, bottle the resulting wine etc... Low intervention winemaking and natural winemaking aim to produce wines that are an honest expression of the vineyard they grew, of the land, climate and year, and of the gentle care taken by human hands to ripen them. # **LARGE BOTTLE SIZES**

"A magnum bottle of wine is the perfect size for two people if one of them isn't drinking". While that may be a bit of an exaggeration, it's true that magnum bottles are excellent choices for group imbibing. Magnum bottles also have unexpected benefits. Although the itself doubles in size, the cork typically does not. Since corks are not entirely airtight, a small amount of oxygen seeps into any bottle over time, aging and developing the juice itself. Therefore, magnum bottles expose double the amount of wine to roughly the same amount of oxygen, lengthening the aging process and keeping wines fresher for longer.
